
Our own Mike Caskey puts a quote from Roger Staubach on all his correspondence. It reads, "There are no traffic jams along the extra mile".

## Contemplations by Chuck

### Christ is the perfect. . .

In my quiet time and study, I am beginning the book of Hebrews (this is where the Bible says the man is to make the coffee). Actually it is much about the superiority of Christ over angels, Abraham, and the Gospel over the law. I would like to draw five lessons from it about Christ's humanity, then with a stretch perhaps, parallel them to the work of a Stephen Minister.

#### 1. Christ is the perfect human leader.

And He wants to lead you!

While we meet the care receiver at his/her point of need, a Stephen Minister does not seek to LEAD per se by saying here is your answer, do this, he/she does seek to encourage the care receiver to seek God through prayer and study of the Word to find God's answer and provision. In that sense, we are the care-giver, and God is the cure-giver. We are leaders in the sense of taking the initiative, and guiding the

process, of the one-on-one weekly meetings, all confidential.

#### 2. Christ is the perfect human model.

And He is worth imitating!

Obviously no Stephen Minister says, "Copy me!" But rather, "Let's look at Christ, and through many Christian resources see if God helps you to find His way of help, and your perfect direction." We do imitate the grace and love of Christ, humanly, and give the personal touches of compassion, listening, commitment, and patience, which often are communicated more strongly through a live being!

#### 3. Christ is the perfect human sacrifice.

And He died for you.

If the care-receiver struggles with guilt, feelings of worthlessness, or a checkered past which he/she feels is too gross for God to forgive, the Stephen Minister can show what Christ has done to erase those issues, by the verses which speak of Jesus' death and resurrection, all because of His great love for EVERY human being. When one sees that Jesus paid for all the above problems, he/she can come out from under the pile and enjoy life, clean, forgiven, and worth GOD!

#### 4. Christ is the perfect human conqueror.

And He conquered death to give you life.

The Stephen Minister can point out that Christ not only paid the Penalty for sin, but He provides ongoing Power to say no to temptations of sin, daily! That is the ministry of the Holy Spirit, which many Christians do not understand. (If you would like an interesting discussion on the Holy Spirit, meet with Mr. Ed Brooks, at TUPC. He is writing a book about this wonderful provision of the 3rd person of the Trinity.)

#### 5. Christ is the perfect human high priest.

I say human, because He lived as we, and experienced all the needs, wants, desires, and pains that we experience. He identified with us, and knows our every weakness. So He can thus show mercy, love, and understanding, yet at the same time forgiveness; for it was His own body that He laid on the altar as a sacrifice for us so that we did not have to die.

Herein lies the great truth that He was the PERFECT high priest. The Stephen Minister CAN be that human purveyor of love, mercy, and understanding.

God in Christ became a living, breathing, human being: Hebrews points out many reasons why this is so important. Please do not misconstrue the above to some way indicate that Stephen Ministers take the place of Christ. But only in the sense that all Christians are to strive to live like, and for, Him, and that we are to minister to others in His NAME.

## Discipleship Ministry

### An Old Friend

Earlier this month I came across an old friend. No, I didn't bump into someone that I hadn't seen for a while. It was Nehemiah, Chapter 2 to be precise. This year I am reading through the Bible and on the morning of May 5, I came to the book of Nehemiah.

As I started to read, a smile came to my heart in anticipation of what I already knew was about to happen. It still amazes me how our God used foreign kings to support the return of the exiles to Jerusalem and to rebuild the Temple, the city, and the wall. (Did you know that the wall around Jerusalem was rebuilt in an unbelievable 52 days!?! ) WOW!

When I first read this passage years ago, it brought me confusion rather than the comfort that it now brings. Nehemiah was in service to the king of Persia as cupbearer during the exile of Israel to this land. There had previously been two groups of exiles that had returned to Judah, the first under Zerubbabel and the second under Ezra. Nehemiah had recently heard from one of his brothers returning from Judah who had told him that "the wall of Jerusalem is broken down and its gates have been burned". After sharing this with the king we read in Chapter 2 verse 4 "The king said to me, "What is it you want?". Nehemiah replied that he prayed to the God of heaven,


and answered the king, "If it pleases the king" . . . Wait a minute. Scripture says he prayed. What was his prayer? What did he pray? It must have been a powerful prayer because the king was moved to send him back to Jerusalem with the resources to help in the rebuilding of the wall. I want to know the words of this prayer, but scripture does not tell us.

Have you ever been in a situation where you needed to pray but you had no time? I have. "Help me Lord", or "Get me out of this", or "What do I do now?" is all I had time for. I think this is where Nehemiah was. The king asked him, "What is it you want?" If the king asks, you answer. He only had time for a quick prayer. He didn't have time to pray for his needs, no time to go to his knees.

We have to dig a little deeper for the answer. Go back to Chapter 1. In verse 4 Nehemiah says, "For some days I mourned and fasted and prayed . . ." What is 'some days'? The answer is right here. Nehemiah 1:1 says "in the month of Kislev", which is November/December and Nehemiah 2:1 says, "In the month Nisan", which is March/April. Four months. For four months he mourned, fasted and prayed and he prayed a prayer in which he poured his heart out to God as we read in Chapter 1. Now we know that when Nehemiah had to respond there was a difference. He was "prayed up". He had spent time with God. He also knew God's word given to Moses. Chapter 1, vss. 8-9 ". . . I will scatter . . . I will gather." He was ready to answer the king when the question was asked. His prayer must have been something like this, "Lord, your will be done".

Read, study, and obey the Bible. Spend time with God in prayer, every day. Is it difficult? Well, we have a promise of help. John 14:26 tells us, and this is Jesus speaking, "But the Counselor, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in My Name, will teach you all things and will remind you of everything I have said to you". What a wonderful promise.




Two Teams of Young Adults and six check points.

**3/27/19**


**Participants: 7or 8**

## Guatemala Mission Trip Children's Clothing Drive

The children in Guatemala will get great use out of used or new clothing and shoes. Especially shoes, because if they don't have shoes, they cannot go to school. Boys' pants are a huge need as well. Used pants are usually non-existent; boys wear out their jeans so fast! The greatest need is children's clothing size 3T - up to small adult. If you like to shop, thrift store finds and garage sales are always

great, or ask your neighbors, friends and grandparents' friends for children's clothing. Soccer balls and pumps for each child is a wonderful extra as we've learned that playing soccer is their favorite thing to do!


The team, with the Bethel Ministries team, will spend two days of house building, a full day of wheelchair distribution of approximately 50 wheelchairs, and an afternoon of Vacation Bible School for a group of around 80-100 kids. "God is Love" is always our theme. We get Valentine's Day stickers, hearts, make crowns, baskets, and play games.

Home visits include an assessment of the family's situation and needs, nutritional food for a month, and clothing. During the two day home build the first day is concrete pouring of a leveled, bolted and secured slab. The second day consists of a set of pre-cut 2x4 metal studs to make the walls with corrugated sheet metal.

Furnishings include a triple bunk bed, mattresses, sheets, blankets and pillows. A wood efficiency ceramic stove with smoke stack is also very important.

At or near completion the missionary leader gives the family a Bible and prays for them, that they might lead a life in Christ.

This year our fundraising efforts have fallen extremely short of our budgeted goal, and we depend heavily on these funds for the materials to build and furnish the house. We thank you in advance for any extra effort you can provide to help us reach our goals. Please don't hesitate to contact Team Leader, Chris Currie with any questions about this Mission to Guatemala, and as always, your prayer support is much appreciated.

Needless to say, we couldn't accomplish our PDA work without helping hands back home. Your financial generosity makes


