## Everything Has Changed. . .

So much has changed since our last Trinity Trumpet published in March. As I reread the articles, there is no mention of COVID-19; no mention of flattening the curve or sheltering in place or wearing face masks and social distancing; no mention of protests, riots, or threats; no mention of loss of civility or racism or politics. Instead, I talked about hospitality and Lent. We looked forward to Easter and LoveModesto and VBS and fellowship opportunities. We took so much for granted: the freedom to gather as we choose; the simple handshake or loving embrace that we share with friends and loved ones; the respect shown in open and honest conversations; even just seeing one another face to face.

So much has changed in the last four months, and the lamentations readily flow in about what we have lost. We lament the loss of freedom. We lament the loss of rights and speaking our minds. We lament the loss of both independence and interdependence. We lament the celebration of victimhood and destruction of achievement.

### A Quote from My Friend Gary Chamberlain








Director of Young Adult Ministry

*What a crazy couple of months we've all experienced. I truly am grateful for all of our young adults and ministry team members.*

### Young Adults

What have we been up to the last few months? Great Question. Our Young Adult Ministry has met faithfully every week, Sunday nights from 5:00-8:00 PM on Zoom. We've been averaging between 10-15 young adults a week. During this Zoom time, our young adults have attended the meetings from various parts of the country like, Modesto, Ceres, Turlock, Oakdale, Atwater, and the states of Texas and Virginia. We've continued our study with the book, "Life's Healing Choices" by John Baker. Our young adults also continue to share one scene from their favorite movie, book and Bible scene. We call this "Write My Scene". This is a very broad look into their lives thru books, movies and favorite Bible studies. We've also participated in one group devotional series and prayer chain. Social Media wise, we've added a young adult Instagram page (tupc\_ya). During the shelter in place, I had to change the meeting place for those needing counseling. Virginia Corridor Trail became a great meeting place both for exercise and counsel. During the shelter in place I'd walk an average of 7-13 miles a week just meeting with our young adults individually. So needless to say, the group has been adjusting and busy.

### Newlyweds

During the shelter in place, God placed on my heart to gather four couples together to talk about their first year of marriage. This


happened via Zoom on May 2, from 5:00-8:00 PM. It was great. We played the newlywed game which centered around their first 10 months together. I learned a lot from these great young adults. How they met. What they do for a living. Likes and dislikes etc. . . We laughed, and exchanged numbers. God is good. I also tasked each of them to come up with the Top Five lessons they've learned as a couple in their first year of marriage. The list will be posted on our website and mobile APP soon. Stay tuned!

### Worship

Our modern worship team was meeting weekly and rehearsing until March 16th. Due to the progressiveness of Covid-19, we stopped meeting and rehearsing. To help continue to keep the music for our Sunday morning pre-recorded service, I joined our small ensemble. In the month of May, we started the "Outdoor Service" at 8:30 AM. I have been asked to provide music for that. I'm continuing to add instruments each week as well as individuals. At this time, adding vocalists is a challenge due to social distancing and microphones. The instruments and people we've added do not need microphones. We're hoping to solve this problem soon to add more vocalists. So far, I'm very pleased with the adjustment and sound.

### Discipleship

I love how God has, in His own way, thrust the church into "Discipling and Discipleship". Because of current events in our nation (i.e. COVID-19, recent protest demonstrations and riots), Trinity United has put God's Word into action thru the internet. Pastor Tres and staff have been leading the charge with daily devotionals. Our Director of Music Ministry, Melissa, has started explaining some of the hymns and music during our morning worship online. This helps to educate. God has also placed on our hearts to add a prayer component to our mobile APP and website. Just like there are devotionals, we will add soon a "focused prayer" time. And boy do we need it more than ever.

## Embrace Tradition While Moving Forward

The past few months of this year have been remarkably challenging, stretching, frustrating, saddening, and with moments of refreshment, but all in all, it was incredibly revealing. I have learned more of who I am during this season and am strengthening the components of the person God designed me to be. Learning to reach out to people and touch them without an encouraging hand on the shoulder or hug of excitement or comfort . . . it has been very unique to honor each other within comfort levels, yet still let people know that I am present and love them dearly. It has been outside of my normal, the core of who I am. I heard many times to adjust to the new normal while hearing others wanting to go back to normal and it made me feel uneasy about doing either. You see, as the Body of Christ, we are a living being and have life within us, and when we do things that we have always done we can get stuck and stagnant. Yet, the beautiful traditions in churches across the globe have value and purpose, so getting used to the new normal feels like we are forsaking such great parts of what has made us who we are. What I am finding in church ministry across the board, and especially in relation to youth ministry—we need to do both: embrace traditions but keep moving forward. We (definitely including myself) need to come to a place personally where we do not hold things so tightly that they become more important than God or what God is telling and leading us to do; as

harsh as it may seem, we need to call it what it is: an idol. It is not that those things are bad but when we hold them higher than God it is not a good thing. My preferences, wants, and desires cannot overshadow the Lord’s moving in my life, ministry, and our church. So what am I saying? I conclude that we should never be in a place of “normal”. We have been set apart for a reason and are called to have life within us for a reason. We may not look like the church from five, 10 or 20 years ago and we may not look like the church down the street. But Praise God that even though it can be intimidating not knowing what we will look like in the future, believe that we will truly look like the Body of Christ when we truly listen to His leading and consistently live our lives surrendered to His will and plan, because let’s be honest: His ways are much better than anything we can do. May we never settle for good but continuously move toward God and what He is doing.







# Fayetteville Mission Trip

The good news is Fayetteville, North Carolina made it through 2019 without major storm damage. The bad news is the fact that while extensive damage remains following two “500 year storms” in 2016 and 2018, Trinity’s Presbyterian Disaster Assistance team won’t be helping the recovery effort in 2020.

Were this a normal year, our PDA team would be firming up final travel plans and packing for North Carolina, anticipating seven days of rewarding work and another inspiring stay at the Highland Presbyterian Church during the week of June 7-13. Unfortunately, 2020 has been a year like no other in the past 100 years. Instead of flying east, the Trinity PDA team is staying home, learning to cope with the COVID-19 virus, and hoping for a return to Fayetteville in 2021.

2020 would have marked the 14th straight year of partnership between Trinity and PDA. From the Gulf Coast of Mississippi and Louisiana to Tennessee, Pennsylvania, New York, New Jersey, and North Carolina, the Modesto team has helped to bring hope out of chaos for people whose lives have been disrupted by nature’s wrath. This year’s mission trip would have continued a relationship that began in 2018 when we first served residents in the Fayetteville area. With over 1,200 homes still needing repair, there will still be plenty of work for our team once the pandemic fears subside.

While we’ll miss the opportunity to represent TUPC and minister to those impacted by nature’s wrath, this year’s interruption provides an opportunity to reflect on the amazing amount of support we have received from the Trinity family since 2007. Our team never ceases to be amazed by the financial backing we have received over

the years. Even more amazing is the prayer support you have provided us in that time. The work isn’t easy. Team members face a number of physical challenges, starting with warm, humid weather. We expect to get sweaty and dirty. On the most trying days, when our energy ebbs and the projects most demanding, the power of our church family’s prayers comes through, lifting our spirits when the need is greatest.

We’re going to miss those moments in 2020. At the same time, as everyone faces the most daunting of challenges, we draw strength from knowing that the work will go on. With your support and everyone’s prayer, Trinity’s PDA team will be back in 2021, ready to help smooth the way for those we serve.





# Trumpet—“Recalculating”


